In pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, His Majesty's Postmaster-General hereby gives notice that a Warrant, dated the 8th day of March 1902, has been made by him, with the consent of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Post Office Acts, repealing the existing Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrants, and ordering, directing, and declaring that, on and from the 1st day of April 1902, parcels may be transmitted by the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post at the rates of postage respectively specified in the said Warrant, and in accordance with the Regulations and conditions respectively therein contained.
