* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel, or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.

CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION,

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant Examiner in the Patent Office Department of the Board of Trade. (Supplementary to the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for Situations in the Civil Service included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 4th June 1870.)

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 20 and 25, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

2. At the Examination exercises will be set in the following subjects only :—

1. English Composition (including Spelling and Handwriting).
2. Geometry (Plain and Solid).
3. Mechanics and Mechanism.
4. Chemistry.
5. Electricity and Magnetism.
6. General Physics, Hydrostatics, Heat, Light, and Sound.
7. French or German (translation from the language into English).

No subjects are obligatory, but Candidates must obtain such an aggregate number of marks in the Examination as a whole as may indicate, in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners, a competent amount of general proficiency.

3. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

4. A fee of £5 will be required from each Candidate attending an Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Assistant Examiner in the Patent Office, will be held in London, commencing on the 17th February 1903, under the foregoing Regulations.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the Examination.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 29th January 1903, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
