INDIA OFFICE, March 21, 1903.

The Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Mr. John Macintosh to superintend the transfer of lascars, or other persons, at Troon, and to grant the certificate required under section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vict. cap. 60).

The fee to be paid for every lascar, or other person, in respect of whom such certificate is applied for, is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday the 30th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under

the Acts 40 Vict. cap. 2, and 52 Vict. cap. 6, to the amount of £2,000,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 5th April.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1000, £5000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 4th April 1903, and will be payable at twelve months after date, viz., on the 4th April 1904.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday the 31st instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock on Saturday the 4th proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel, or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.

1899.

AIRDRIE AND COATBRIDGE TRAMWAYS.

(Extension of Time for Construction of Tramways; Compulsory Purchase of Lands; Power to lay Cables and place Posts in Streets, Roads, Footpaths, etc.; Qualification of Directors; Limitation of Liability in respect of Accidents; Amendment of Airdrie and Coatbridge Tramways Act, 1900, etc.).

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made by Petition to the Secretary for Scotland under and in pursuance of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland)

Act, 1899, on or before the 17th day of April next, by the Airdrie and Coatbridge Tramways Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") for a Provisional Order for the following purposes or some of them, that is to say:—

1. To extend the time limited by the Airdrie and Coatbridge Tramways Act, 1900, for the construction of the Tramways thereby authorised.

2. To empower the Company to enter upon, take, and use compulsorily or otherwise, and to hold the lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

A plot of land in the Burgh of Coatbridge and Parish of Old Monkland, together with the footpath thereto adjoining, containing 3 roods and 4 poles or thereabouts in area, and situate on the northern side of Main Street, and extending between points respectively 157 yards and 234 yards or thereabouts, measured in an easterly direction from Jackson Street, and to empower the Company to erect and construct thereon a depôt or car shed or other works for the purposes of their undertaking.

3. To empower the Company to enter upon, open, and break up the surface of or otherwise interfere with any streets, roads, footpaths, footways, bridges, sewers, drains, gas, water, electric, telephonic and telegraphic pipes, and other apparatus within the Burghs of Airdrie and Coatbridge, in the County of Lanark, and to lay down in, on, under, or over, within or across the same, all such posts, standards, conduits, cables, wires, tubes, plates, or apparatus as may be necessary or convenient for working the tramways authorised by the Airdrie and Coatbridge Tramways Act, 1900, and the Coatbridge Tramways Order, 1901, or for providing access to or in connection with any depôt or works of the Company, or any generating station from which electrical energy shall be supplied for the purpose of working such tramways.

4. To amend section 30 of the Airdrie and Coatbridge Tramways Act, 1900, with respect to the qualification of Directors of the Company.

5. To restrict the liability of the Company in respect of accidents to passengers travelling in carriages provided for the use of the labouring classes.

6. To incorporate in the Order all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845, and, if thought fit, to exempt the Company from any of such provisions, and in particular from section 90 of that Act, and to alter, amend, extend, or repeal the Airdrie and Coatbridge Tramways Act, 1900, and the Coatbridge Tramways Order, 1901.
