[^0]:    * Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 188\%, proviles that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any olher measure than the imperial busbel, or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conpersion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-mine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
