FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 14th July 1903 he made an Order under section 40 (4) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, extending the exceptions in that section which permit young persons to have the meal hours at different times, and to remain during meal times in rooms in which a manufacturing process is being carried on, to male young persons employed in iron and steel foundries in Scotland.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1.
