ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 11TH AUGUST 1903.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Schedule to this Order shall be substituted for the Schedule to the Order of the Board of Agriculture, dated the sixth day of August last, declaring a Swine Fever Infected Area.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture have hereunto set their Official Seal this eleventh day of August one thousand nine hundred and three.
