

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 30th December 1903 he made an Order under sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, modifying the proportion of cubic feet of space to be provided for each person employed in Underground Bakehouses and in Bakehouses (other than such as are under ground) where work

is carried on at night by artificial light other than electric light. The proportion for underground bakehouses is fixed at 500 cubic feet, and for the other class of bakehouses at 400 cubic feet.
