The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The provisions of the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 shall not apply to the movement of any swine to the Show Ground of the Ayrshire Agricultural Association at Ayr, on any day between the twenty-second and twenty-eighth days of April 1905, provided that the same are moved by the nearest available route and are accompanied by a licence granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Local Authority of the Burgh of Ayr.
