THE King has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable the Earl of Selborne, P.C., G.C.M.G., to be High Commissioner for South Africa, and Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Transvaal and Orange River Colonies.

FOREIGN OFFICE, March 28, 1905.
