(1) To carry on the business of Health or Sickness Insurance and Personal Accident Insurance in all its branches, and to grant or effect insurances against or upon the contingency of death, injury, incapacity, damage, or loss to persons by reason of accidents or disease of any description.

(2) To carry on the business of Employers' Liability Insurance in all its branches, including Workmen's Compensation Insurance, and to grant assurances to protect principals or employers from or against liability or loss by reason of the death of or injury to any of their workmen, agents, or employees, by accidents of any agents, or employees, by accidents or any description, and to grant assurances to protect principals and employers and otherwise to indemnify principals or employers from or against liability to third parties by reason of injury, damage, or loss through any act or fault of their own or caused by agents, workmen, servants, or others in their employ, or acting on their hehalf. acting on their behalf.

(3) To carry on the business of Guarantee Insurance in all its branches, and to guarantee the fidelity of persons in situations of trust and the due performance and discharge of any office, appointment, duty, contract, or obligation by any person or persons, and to indemnify persons who are or may become sureties for others.
