FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST.

The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 20) Warrant, 1906.

In pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, His Majesty's Postmaster-General hereby gives notice that a Warrant, dated the 30th day of June 1906, has been made by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General on the subject of outgoing parcels to British East Africa and to the British Central Africa Protectorate.

The following Areas are now subject to the provisions of the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903:—
