COUNTY COUNCIL ELECTORAL DIVISIONS
OF THE COUNTY OF STIRLING—
POLICE BURGH OF GRANGEMOUTH.

ORDER by the Secretary for Scotland.

WHEREAS by their Order, dated 22nd January 1892, the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland determined the contents and boundaries of the Electoral Divisions of the County of Stirling, including the Police Burghs therein, and, *inter alia*, determined that the Police Burgh of Grangemouth should be divided into two Electoral Divisions, called the Grangemouth First Electoral Division and the Grangemouth Second Electoral Division :

And whereas by the Grangemouth Waterworks and Burgh Extension Order Confirmation Act, 1905, the boundaries of the Burgh of Grangemouth were extended so as to include parts of various Electoral Divisions of the said County, in the Parishes of Grangemouth and Falkirk :

And whereas, in view of the foregoing change of circumstances, it has been represented to me by the County Council of the County of Stirling that I should issue an Order, under section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, altering the contents and boundaries of the Electoral Divisions in the Police Burgh of Grangemouth :

And whereas I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the said representation :
Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable John Sinclair, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Local Government (Scotland) Acts, order as follows :—

The Order of the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland, dated the 22nd January 1892, dealing with the Electoral Divisions of the County of Stirling, is hereby recalled in so far as the two divisions thereby formed within the Police Burgh of Grangemouth are concerned ; and from and after this date the said Police Burgh shall be divided into two County Council Electoral Divisions, having the following names and contents, viz :—

Number of Division.	Name of Division.	Contents of Division.
42	Grangemouth First.	That part of the Police Burgh of Grangemouth which lies within the following line, viz., commencing at a point in the boundary of the Burgh in the centre of the public road leading from Polmont to Airth at its junction near the south-west entrance gate to Kerse House with a new road named Earl's Road, and commencing in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Earl's Road to a point near the westmost corner of the south timber basin, which point is in line with the continuation in a direct line of the centre line of Kerse Road; thence in a south-easterly direction along said continuation line and the centre line of Kerse Road to a point in the centre of the Grange Burn in line with the centre line of Kerse Road; thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the Grange Burn to the centre of the bridge which carries the Bo'ness Road across Grange Burn; thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the Bo'ness Road to a point in the boundary of the Burgh where it crosses the centre of the Bo'ness Road; thence along the southern and western boundary of the Burgh to the point of commencement.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACTS.

COUNTY COUNCIL ELECTORAL DIVISIONS OF FIFE—PARISH OF MARKINCH.

ORDER by the Secretary for Scotland.

Whereas since the date of the Order of the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland forming Electoral Divisions for the County of Fife, a material change of circumstances has occurred in respect of the population and annual value of the Electoral Divisions in the Parish of Markinch, in the said County:

And whereas the County Council of Fifeshire have applied to me for a rearrangement of the Electoral Divisions within the said Parish:

And whereas I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the proposal of the said County Council:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable John Sinclair, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do, in virtue of the powers conferred on me by section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, order as follows:—

The Order of the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland, dated 3rd November 1891, dealing with the Electoral Divisions of the County of Fife, is hereby recalled, in so far as the Divisions of Markinch North and Markinch South are concerned, and from and after this date there shall be constituted in lieu thereof County Council Electoral Divisions, having the following names and contents, that is to say:—

MARKINCH NORTH.—That part of the Parish of Markinch which lies to the north of a line drawn first in a generally north-easterly direction along the north side of the

Leslie Branch Line of the North British Railway from the point at which it intersects the western boundary of the Parish to its junction with the main line of the North British Railway from Edinburgh to Dundee, thence southwards along the east side of said main line to the River Leven, thence generally in an easterly direction along the said River Leven to the bridge over said River Leven at Milton, thence northwards from said Milton Bridge along the Milton Brae public road and the line of said road continued until the boundary of the Parish of Markinch is reached at the Myres.

MARKINCH SOUTH.—The remainder of the Parish of Markinch.

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (Bureau OF KINGUSSIE) ORDER, 1906, dated 17th August 1906.

Whereas by Section 9, as read with Section 12, of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Secretary for Scotland with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which

the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour :

And whereas by Section 10, as read with Section 18, of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that local authorities within the meaning of Section 9 of the said Act shall give public notice of any regulation of the Secretary for Scotland made in pursuance of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the use of motor cars on any highway, or part of a highway, or limiting the speed of motor cars within any limits or place, and for the purpose of giving effect to any such regulation, shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near the highway, part of a highway, limits or place, to which the regulation refers :

And whereas the Town Council of the Burgh of Kingussie, being the local authority of the said Burgh, have applied to me to make regulations under Section 9 of the said Act, and I am of opinion that it is desirable to give effect to the said application to the extent hereinafter mentioned :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf, I, the Right Honourable John Sinclair, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following regulations under the said Section 9 :—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (Burgh of Kingussie) Order, 1906," and the regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect within the limits or places referred to therein on and after the respective dates at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the local authority shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near such limits or places.
2. A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour within the limits or places specified in the schedule to these regulations.

Limits or Places.

The main street of the Burgh of Kingussie, measured from a point opposite the lamp-post at Westfield House, at the south approach to the Burgh, to a point ten yards north of the northmost lamp-post of the Burgh.

* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.

Owen Tolhurst Pettitt (commonly known as Owen Tolhurst), Five Oak Green, Capel, in the county of Kent, wheelwright and blacksmith.

THE Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Councillors of the Burgh of Perth have presented in the Sheriff Court of Perthshire at Perth a Petition praying the Court (1) to extend the Boundaries of the said Burgh of Perth for the purposes of the Burgh Police (Scotland) Acts, and the Town Councils (Scotland) Acts, by adding the following areas or districts thereto, viz.:—In the first place, that area or piece of ground in the Parish of Kinnoull, and County of Perth, extending from a junction with the existing boundary of the Burgh at a point sixty-seven yards or thereby north-west from the road leading from Perth to Coupar-Angus north-eastwards to a point forty-seven yards north-west of the above-mentioned road; thence south-eastwards to a point on the footpath leading from Gannochy to Muirhall; thence south-eastwards to a point on south side of burn three hundred and ninety-two yards east of where it enters a culvert; thence southwards to a point on the east boundary of the grounds of James Murray's Royal Lunatic Asylum three hundred and ten yards north of the old road from Perth to Dundee; thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the grounds of said Asylum to a point where said boundary meets said old road from Perth to Dundee; thence southwards to a junction with the existing boundary of the Burgh at Kinnoull Hill Cottage; thence north-westwards along the existing Burgh Boundary to the point at which the description started: In the second place, that area or piece of ground in the Parish of Perth, and County of Perth, extending from a junction with the existing boundary of the Burgh in the centre of the Willowgate Branch of the River Tay at the boundary between the Parishes of Kinnoull and Kinfauns south-eastwards along the centre of the said Willowgate Branch to a point in the centre of the main channel of the River Tay; thence westwards along the centre of the main channel of the River Tay to a point opposite the northern extremity of the eastern boundary of Lower Friarton Farm; thence southwards across the river and along the eastern and southern boundaries of said Lower Friarton Farm to a point where said farm boundary meets the road from Perth to Edinburgh; thence north-westwards along the north-east side of said road to a point one hundred and ten yards south of the old toll-house on said road; thence north-westwards to a junction with the existing Burgh Boundary at the cistern between two fields on St. Magdalene's Farm; thence eastwards and south-eastwards along the existing Burgh Boundary to the point at which the description started: And in the third place, that area or piece of ground in the Parish of Tibbermore, and County of Perth, extending from a junction with the existing boundary as it cuts the south side of road leading from Perth to Clallow westwards along that side of the road for a distance of two hundred and seventeen yards; thence northwards to a point on the road from Cherrybank to Burghmuir; thence northwards to a point on the road leading from Goodlyburn to Letham House where Goodlyburn stream passes under the road; thence eastwards and northwards along the centre of Goodlyburn stream to the north-west corner of the piece of ground let with Balhousie Toll-House on Crieff Road; thence eastwards to a junction with the existing boundary of the Burgh as it cuts the centre of the road leading from Perth to Dunkeld; thence south-westwards along the existing Burgh Boundary to the point at which the description started. All as said several districts are more particularly described in the Petition and as delineated on the Plan after-mentioned.
