Whereas by an Act passed in a Session of Parliament holden in the third year of Our reign, intituled "An Act to reorganise the Administration of the Patriotic Fund," the Patriotic Fund Commission constituted by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, by Warrant under the Royal Sign Manual, dated the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, was dissolved, and the property, rights, duties, and liabilities thereof, and all property held in trust therefor, were transferred to and vested in the Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation established in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas in pursuance of the powers vested in Us by the said recited Act, We did by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual bearing date the seventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and four, appoint you Our said Most Dear Brother and Councillor Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, together with the gentlemen therein named, to be the first "appointed members" (twelve in number) of the Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation, and by a further Warrant bearing date the eighteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and five, did appoint you the said Paul Sanford, Baron Methuen, to fill a vacancy iu the body of the members of the said Corporation:

And whereas by the said Act which came into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and four, it is enacted that after the expiration of three years immediately succeeding the commencement of the Act, the members of the said Corporation to be appointed by Us by Warrant under the Sign Manual shall be six in number:

Now know ye that We do by these Presents under Our Royal Sign Manual, ordain and declare that you Our said Most Dear Biother and Councillor Aithur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, together with you the said Paul Sanford, Baron Methuen, Sir Francis Mowatt, Sir Cyprian Arthur George Bridge, Sir Frederick Thomas Murzials, and Charles Henry Renn Stansfield, shall be Members of the Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation, to exercise for the term of three years from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seven, in conjunction with the six members co-opted by the General Council, and the exofficio members specified in the First Schedule to the said Act, the powers and duties transferred to that body as aforesaid, and generally to carry into effect the provisions of the said Act :

And We do further ordain that you Our said Most Deur Brother and Councillor Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, shall be President of the General Council of the said Corporation.

Given at Our Court at Sandringham the twenty-fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and six, in the sixth year of Our Reign.
