

## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 86 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that on the 21st January 1907, he made Regulations under section 79 of the said Act, to come into force on the 1st February 1907, to apply to all factories and workshops in which dry carbonate of lead or red lead is used in the manufacture of paints and colours, or chromate of lead is produced by boiling.

The following Areas are now subject to the provisions of the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903:—

*Aberdeenshire, Argyllshire, Banffshire, Bute, Caithness, Clackmannan, Elgin, Fife, Forfarshire, Inverness-shire, Kincardineshire, Kinross, Nairn, Orkney, Perthshire, Ross and Cromarty, Stirlingshire, Sutherland, and Zetland.*—An Area comprising the Counties of Aberdeen, Argyll, Banff, Bute, Caithness, Clackmannan, Elgin, Fife, Forfar, Inverness, Kincardine, Kinross, Nairn, Orkney, Perth, Ross and Cromarty, Stirling, Sutherland, and Zetland, and the detached part of the County of Dumbarton; the Cities of Aberdeen, Dundee, and Perth; and the Burghs of Peterhead, Campbelltown, Elgin, Dunfermline, Kirkcaldy, Airthroath, Brechin, Forfar, Montrose, Inverness, Falkirk, and Stirling (1st August 1906).
