SPECIAL REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the Situation of Assistant to the Head of the Fisheries Branch of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries. (Supplementary to the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 4th June 1870.)

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 22 and 35, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

II. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

- 1. English Composition and Précis Writing,
- 2. French.
- 3. German.
- 4. Zoology and Animal Physiology.
- The Salmon and Freshwater Fisheries Acts, 1861 to 1896, and the Sea Fisheries Regulation Acts, 1888 to 1894, and any Act amending the same.

Note.—Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in the subjects numbered 1, 3, 4, and 5.

III. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.

IV. A fee of £2 will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 4TH SEPTEMBER 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall in their application to any infected Area comprising the whole or any part of the District specified in the First Schedule to this Order be modified in manner declared by this Order.
- 2. Swine may between the date hereof and the thirtieth day of November next (including both those days), be moved between different parts of a farm in the same occupation for the purpose of stubbling or of feeding acorns, mast, or other like food, along, over, or across any highway or thoroughfare in the Infected Area in which the farm is situate, subject to the following conditions:—
  - (i.) swine affected with or suspected of swine-fever may not be moved under this Order;
  - (ii.) swine may not be moved under this Order into or out of a Swine-Fever Infected Place, or if the movement of the swine is prohibited by notice given by an Inspector

of a Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries given under any Order of that Board;

- (iii.) a license authorising movement under this Order must be obtained from the Clerk of the Local Authority of the District, or of any Committee of the Local Authority, or from any person appointed by the Local Authority to act as Chief Inspector for the purposes of the above-mentioned Acts, and any such licence is available and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, and may be determined at any time by a notice given or sent by post to such occupier by any person authorised by this Order to issue licences; and
- (iv.) the swine must be moved by the nearest available route and without unecessary delay, and must be accompanied by the licence authorising the movement.
- 3. T is O der shall cease to operate on the first day of December, nineteen hundred and seven.
