BY THE KING. — A PROCLAMATION.
For a General Fast. GRORGE R.

WE, taking into our most serious consideration the just and necessary war in which we are engaged, and putting our trust in Almighty God that he will graciously bless our arms, both by sea and land, haveresolved, and do, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, hereby command, that a public day of fasting and humiliation be observed throughout that part of our kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, on Thursday the twenty-first day of February next ensuing, that so both we and our people may humble ourselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain pardon of our sins, and, in the most devout and solemn manner, send up our prayers and supplications to the Divine Majessy, for averting those heavy judgements which our manifold provocations have most justly deserved; and for imploring his blessing and assistance on our arms, for the restoration of peace, and prosperity to us and our

dominions: And we do strictly charge and command, that the said public fall be reverently and devoutly observed by all our loving subjects in Scotland, as they tender the savour of Almighty God, and would avoid his wrath and indignation; and upon pain of such publishment as we may justly insict on all such as contemn and neglect the performance of so religious and people. may justly inflict on all such as contemn and ne-glect the performance of for religious and neces-fary a duty: Our will is, therefore, and we charge, that this our proclamation seen, ye forth-with proceed to the Market Cross of Edmourgh, and all other places needful, and there, in our name and authority, make publication hereof, that none pretend ignorance: And our will and name and authority, make publication hereof, that none pretend ignorance: And our will and pleasure is, that our Solicitor do cause printed copies hereof to be sent to the Sherists of the several shires, stewards of stewartries; and bailists of regalities, and their clerks, whom we ordain to see the same published; and we do appoint them to send copies hereof to the several parish churches within their bounds, and that, upon the Lord's day immediately preceding the day above-Lord's day immediately preceding the day above-mentioned, the same may be published and read from the pulpits immediately after divine ser-
