#### COUNTY OF INVERNESS. PARISH OF KILMORACK.

**A** PETITION has been presented by the Parish Council of the Parish of Kilmorack, in the County of Inverness, setting forth that the space of the old Burial Ground or Churchyard situated at Kilmorack had become overcrowded, and that, in response to a Petition which was submitted to them on 9th November 1903, additional ground lying on the north side of the public road leading from Beauly to Strathglass and adjoining the Parish Church of the said Parish of Kilmorack, and extending in area to 2 Roods or thereby imperial measure, had been acquired by the Parish Council on feu from Lord Lovat. The Feu Charter, together with a copy of the Rules and Regulations for the new or additional Churchyard or Burial Ground, signed by the Chairman and Clerk of the said Parish Council, is produced with the Petition, and is open to inspection in the Sheriff Clerk's Office, Inverness.
