The King has been pleased to order a Conge d'Elire to pass the Great Seal, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Norwich, to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being void by the translation of the Most Reverend Father in God Dr Charles Manners Sutton to the Archbishopric of Canterbury; and his Majesty has also been pleased, by his Royal Sign Manual, to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter Henry Bathurst, Clerk, Doctor of Laws, to be by them elected Bishop of that See.
