Copy of a Letter from Vice Admiral Sir John Thomas Duckworth, K. B. Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels at Jamaica, to William Marsden, Esq. dated at Port Royal the 19th of January, 1805:

You will herewith receive, for the information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the copy of a letter from the Honourable F. F. Gardener, stating the capture of the French brig privateer Regulus, commanded by Jacque Mathieu.

Sir, Princes Charlotte, Dec. 13, 1804.

I have the honour to inform you, that at ten A. M. Cape Antonio, east four leagues, made all f.il in chace of a brig: and after a hard chace of feven hours, with a fresh breeze, came up with her in lat. 20 deg. 50 min. N. long. 85 deg. 32 min. W. having steered south the whole of the chace, and firing four or five shot at her she struck, and proves to be the French privateer brig Regulus, from Guadaloupe, commanded by Citizen Jacque Mathieu,

pierced for fourteen guns, but only eleven mounted, (having thrown two overboard, with her boats and ipars in the chace,) and eighty-four men. She is a very fine veffel, fails remarkably well, is coppered, and is, in my opinion, perfectly adapted for his Majesty's service.
