NOTICE is hereby given that the Lockerbie District Committee of the County Council of the County of Dumfriesshire, as Local Authority of said District under the Local Government (Scotland) Acts, 1889 to 1908, and the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1897, having at a meeting convened in terms of the last-mentioned Act, and held at Lockerbie on the 15th day of September 1910, considered the propriety of (a) dissolving the aforementioned Special Water Supply District, and (b) forming part of their District into a new Special Water Supply District, did at said Meeting resolve as follows:—

"That the District Committee (first) do resolve and determine that the present Ecclefechan Special Water Supply District shall cease to exist as a Special Water Supply District, and (second) resolve to form and do form the following part of their District into a Special Water Supply District within the meaning and for the purposes of the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1897, to be known as the ECCLEFECHAN SPECIAL WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT, viz.,—that part situated in the Parish of Hoddom which is bounded from A to B by the boundary between the Parishes of Hoddom and Middlebie, from B to C by the Mein Water to its junction with the River Annan, from C to D by the River Annan being the boundary between the Parish of Hoddom and the Parishes of Annan and Cummertrees, from D to E by the boundary between the Parishes of Hoddom and St. Mungo, from E to F by an irregular line passing the south side of Whitehill Cottages and cutting the Parish Boundary at F, from F to G by the boundary between the Parishes of Hoddom and St. Mungo, and from G to A by an irregular line passing on the north side of Upper Burnside, the south side of New Orchard, the east side of Langdyke, and the north side of Skailwood, cutting the Parish Boundary at A, with the whole Lands and Heritages situated within the said area, all as the said area is delineated and tinted pink and contained within an outline coloured red on the Ordnance Survey Map signed by the Chairman and the Clerk as relative to this Resolution; further, that the foregoing Resolution be published by advertisement in the Edinburgh Gazette, the Annandale Observer, and the Annandale Herald newspapers, and take effect as at and from the 8th day of October 1910;"
