TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Wednesday the 8th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vict., cap. 2, and 52 Vict., cap. 6, to the amount of £3,600,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 11th instant.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1000, £5000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 11th February 1911, and will be payable at six months after date, viz., on the 11th August 1911.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Thursday the 9th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock, on Saturday the 11th February 1911.

6. The Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
