CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES. COURT OF CLAIMS.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty to hear and determine all Claims of Services to be performed at the time of the ensuing Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 19th day of July 1910), and of fees to be received for the same, hereby require all persons who may still be desirous of exhibiting Petitions and Claims concerning such Services to make their Petitions or Claims on or before Saturday the 4th day of March next.

The said Commissioners, at their Meeting held at the Council Office, Whitehall, on the 16th day of December 1910, resolved as follows:—

- 1. All Claims must be made by Petition-Petitions may be sent under cover to the Clerks of the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Downing Street, London, S.W.
- 2. Petitioners are not required to appear in person unless summoned.
- 3. Petitioners may appear by Counsel, Solicitors, or Agents.
- 4. If a Claim was admitted in 1901-2, all that is required from the Petitioner (or his present representative) is a short formal Petition (without Appearance) stating that he is the same Petitioner, or his representative (and if representative in what capacity)

and that the Petition was allowed in 1901-2, in order that there may be a record.

- 5. No Claim excluded by the Court in 1901-2 as inappropriate to the Coronation by reason of the Royal Proclamation, and inappropriate for the same reason to the forthcoming Coronation, will be placed on the List.
- Committee for the purposes of arrangements

for the Coronation, shall be referred to the same Committee.

The Commissioners are required by the Proclamation to exclude from their consideration such claims as may be submitted to them in respect of Rights or Services connected with the parts of the Ceremonial heretofore per-formed in Westminster Hall and with the Pro-6. Any Claim now made, which was referred by the Court in 1901-2 to the Executive cession, the Ceremony being confined to Westminster Abbey.

WHITEHALL, February 11, 1911.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Frank Smith and John Wapplington under the following circumstances:—

On the 30th September 1910, John Wapplington and another labourer, named Albert Templeman, were engaged in sinking a well at East Markham, in Nottinghamshire, and had fired a shot in order to blast the rock at the bottom. After an interval, during which they tested the air with a lighted lamp and found no gas, Templeman went down the well and struck the rock with a crowbar. Immediately afterwards he cried out that he was feeling dizzy, and asked Wapplington to lower a ladder and rope. He did not wait to fasten a rope round himself, but tried to mount the ladder, and fell back when he was half way up. Wap-plington, calling for help, went down to Templeman's assistance; but found that he could not lift him, and came up in a dazed condition. After a rest of a quarter of an hour, he bravely made another attempt; but called out that he could not attach the rope to Templeman, as he was overcome by the gas. He managed, however, to reach the top before becoming unconscious. Frank Smith, foreman, then came to the spot with other men, and, fastening the rope round his body, went down the well, and succeeded in getting the rope round Templeman, by which means he was hauled up. Smith reached the surface in a state of collapse, though he soon recovered. Templeman was found to be dead.

His Majesty has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Hugh Thomas Hughes under the following circumstances:—

On the evening of the 30th August 1910, Mr. Samuel Needham, of Man Farm, Castleton, Derbyshire, was driving his cattle from a field on his farm to his farm buildings, when a buil attacked him, and, knocking him down, began to gore him. Mr. H. T. Hughes, a District Surveyor, who lives at Chapel-en-le-frith, and happened to be passing at the time, at once went to Mr. Needham's help, and managed to drive off the bull by beating it about the face and eyes with his cap. If it had not been for Mr. Hughes' timely and courageous action, in all probability Mr. Needham would have been killed or seriously injured.

WHITEHALL, February 14, 1911.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to William John Soper under the following circumstances .—

On the 13th September 1909, a fire occurred in the Côte d'Or Mine at Obuassi, Gold Coast, and a European named Penrose and eight natives lost their lives. The fire broke out about 500 feet from the entrance of one of the levels by which the workings were ap-

proached, fumes overwhelming those who tried to put it out. W. J. Soper, a miner, went in with two natives, and, crawling along through foul air which extinguished their candles, found three unconscious natives, all of whom they saved alive. Soper dragged one back to a place where the air was pure; the two natives brought another; Soper returned and fetched a third, and then was overpowered himself. He returned again, however, in company of a native, who lost his life, and followed by a European they recovered Penrose's body. While they were carrying the body out, Soper was again affected by the fumes, but later he made three more attempts to enter the mine, desisting only when he could no longer face the gas.
