Whereas it hath been represented unto Us that a Commission should forthwith issue to investigate the working of the Railway Conciliation and Arbitration Scheme, signed on behalf of the principal Railway Companies and of three Trade Unions of Railway employes at the Board of Trade on November 6th, 1907, and to report what changes (if any) are desirable with a view to the prompt and satisfactory settlement of differences:

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorised and appointed, and do by these Presents authorise and appoint you, the said

Sir David Harrel (Chairman); Sir Thomas Ratcliffe Ratcliffe-Ellis; Charles Gabriel Beale; Arthur Henderson; and John Burnett to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any two or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do by these Presents authorise and empower you, or any two or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any two or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any two or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any two or more of you, your opinion upon the matter herein submitted for your consideration.

Given at Our Court at Saint James' the twenty-second day of August one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the second year of Our Reign.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the manufacture and decoration of pottery (that is to say china, earthenware, tiles, or other articles made from clay, with or without the addition of other material), the making of lithographic transfers, frits, or glazes for use in the manufacture and decoration of pottery, and processes incidental thereto, to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make Regulations to apply to all factories and workshops in which such processes (excepting the manufacture of unglazed or salt-glazed coarse ware in a factory in which no other pottery is made, the manufacture of sanitary or drain pipes and the manufacture of bricks) are carried on.

Copies of the Regulations proposed to be made may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, London.

Objections to the draft Regulations by or on behalf of any persons affected by the Regulations must be sent to the Secretary of State within 40 days from the date of this notice.
