The Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed the Officers named below to superintend the transfer of lascars or other persons at the ports named below, and to grant the certificate required under section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vict., cap. 60).

The fee to be paid for every lascar or other person in respect of whom such certificate is applied for is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.
