THE King has been graciously pleased to give orders for the following appointment to the Most Honourable Order of the Bath:—

*To be an Ordinary Member of the Civil Division of the First Class or Knights Grand Cross—*

At the Court at Balmoral, the 3rd day of October 1911.

PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 238 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," it is provided that, where it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are, or will be, given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in that country, His Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that section shall apply in the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions, and qualifications contained in the Order.

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 9th October 1903, His late Majesty, by and

with the advice of His Privy Council, was pleased to order and declare that seamen not being slaves (and not being British subjects) who, within His Majesty's dominions, desert from ships belonging to subjects of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, should be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships:

And whereas it is desirable to repeal the said Order in Council of the 9th day of October 1903:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are given by the Government of Japan for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in that country:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by virtue of the power vested in Him by the hereinbefore recited sub-section (1) of section 238 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette the said section 238 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," shall apply in the case of Japan, subject to the condition and qualification following, that is to say, that the application for assistance by the competent Consular Officer of Japan shall be accompanied by an assurance that all expenses connected therewith shall be repaid, and that this Order shall not apply to subjects of His Majesty.

And His Majesty by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the provisions of section 738 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is further pleased to order and declare that upon and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette, the Order in Council made on the 9th

day of October 1903 shall be revoked, and the same is hereby revoked accordingly.

ALTERATION OF PARISH AREAS.

FINAL ORDER NO. XLVI.

PARISHES OF NEWBATTLE AND  
COCKPEN.

**W**HEREAS it has been jointly represented to me by the Parish Councils of the Parishes of Newbattle and Cockpen that I should issue an Order under section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, and section 46 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1894, altering the joint boundary of the said Parishes so far as it passes through (1) part of a row of houses known as 190 to 199 Monkswood; and (2) two houses known as 7 and 8 Saugh's Cottages, all situate within the village of Newton Grange;

And whereas, after consulting with the authorities concerned, I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the said representation: and whereas I caused the proposed Order to be published in the Edinburgh Gazette of the 25th August 1911.

Now therefore I, the Right Honourable John, Baron Pentland, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Local Government (Scotland) Acts, order as follows:—

1. The eastern side of the public road from Edinburgh to Galashiels, passing through the Parish of Newbattle, shall hereafter form the boundary line between the Parish of Newbattle and the Parish of Cockpen from the point where the existing boundary line intersects the said public road (as shown on the Ordnance Survey Sheet, Edinburghshire, VIII, 15, Edition of 1907) to a point one thousand three hundred and ten feet southward thereof, where it again meets the said public road; and that part of the Parish of Cockpen which lies between the existing boundary line of the said Parishes and the said public road between the said points shall cease to be part of the Parish of Cockpen, and shall form part of the Parish of Newbattle.

2. The Parish Council of Newbattle shall assume responsibility for, and shall relieve the Parish Council of Cockpen of all advances which the latter body may be called upon to make for or on account of any pauper whose claim is derived (1) from birth in the portion of the Parish of Cockpen transferred to the Parish of Newbattle by the operation of this Order prior to the fifteenth day of May 1912; or (2) from residence for the statutory period in the said portion of the Parish of Cockpen prior to the fifteenth day of May 1912.

3. The portion of the Parish of Cockpen by this Order transferred to the Parish of Newbattle shall cease to be part of the County Council Electoral Division of Cockpen and shall form part of the County Council Electoral Division of Newbattle.

4. Nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of creditors or of persons having vested

interests; and all questions of adjustment consequent on the alteration of boundaries hereby made are expressly reserved.

5. This Order shall take effect on the fifteenth day of May 1912.

With reference to the notification which appeared in the London Gazette of the 6th instant, His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received, through His Majesty's Ambassador at Rome, a Declaration from the Italian Government with respect to Contraband of War, of which the following is a translation:—

Rome, October 4th, 1911.

The Ministry for Foreign Affairs has the honour to notify that, having regard to the state of war existing between Italy and Turkey, the following articles will be considered by Italy as Contraband of War in accordance with the provisions of the Mercantile Marine Code of the Kingdom:—

Cannon, rifles, carbines, revolvers, pistols, swords and other weapons, whether firearms or sidearms, munitions of war, military equipment of every species, and generally everything which without manipulation can be put to immediate use in connection with land or maritime warfare.

The Royal Ministry for Foreign Affairs at the same time notifies that, since the Ottoman Government have taken no steps with a view to exempting Italian merchant vessels from capture, but, on the contrary, have committed acts of



seizure and capture to the prejudice of Italian merchant vessels, the Royal Government, in conformity with the provisions of the laws in force and the general principles of the law of nations, reserve to themselves the right of capture and seizure of Ottoman merchant vessels.

The Royal Ministry for Foreign Affairs will be glad if the above declaration can be brought as soon as possible to the knowledge of the Governments concerned.

WHITEHALL, October 9, 1911.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Hugh Edward Poynter, Esq., of the Ottoman Public Debt Administration, Constantinople, His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to accept and wear the Insignia of the Third Class of the Imperial Ottoman Order of the Medjidieh, conferred upon him by His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him.

WHITEHALL, October 9, 1911.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto the under-mentioned Officers of the Royal Navy, who are employed as Instructors in the Chinese Imperial Naval College at Nanking, His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to accept and wear Decorations (as stated against their respective names), which have been conferred upon them by His Majesty the Emperor of China, in recognition of valuable services rendered by them:—

CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION,

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (supplementary to the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 10th January 1910) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the following group of situations, viz. :—

Admiralty: Junior Appointments in the Supply and Accounting Departments;

Crown Agents for the Colonies: Class III. Clerkships;

Ecclesiastical Commission: Junior Clerkships;

Exchequer and Audit Department: Examinerships;

Inland Revenue Department: Assistant Surveyorships of Taxes; Second Class Clerkships in the Estate Duty Offices, London, Edinburgh, and Dublin;

Metropolitan Police: Second Class Clerkships in the Commissioner's Office; Second Class Clerkships in the Receiver's Office.

Trade, Board of: Assistant Examinerships in the Department of the Inspector-General in Bankruptcy;

War Office: Junior Appointments in the Royal Ordnance Factories.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 18 and 19½, the half-year being reckoned by calendar months. If an Examination commences in one of the first seven months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st of May of that year. If an Examination commences in one of the last five months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st of November of that year.

Both the subjects in Class I. must be taken up. No Candidate will be eligible who fails to pass a qualifying examination in Arithmetic and English.

From Classes II. and III. Candidates may select subjects, one of which must be a language, carrying marks up to a maximum of 10,000, making with the subjects in Class I. 14,000 in all. The same subject may not be selected both in Class II. and in Class III.

3. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. A fee of £3 will be required from each Candidate attending an Examination.

5. From the list resulting from each Examina-

tion will be filled (provided there be Candidates duly qualified)—

- (a) All the appointments which may have been reported to the Civil Service Commissioners as vacant or about to become vacant up to the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination;
- (b) Such additional appointments becoming vacant within four months from the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination as the Head of the Department may desire to have so filled.

Candidates will be allowed to choose, according to their place on the list, among the vacancies (a) for which they are duly qualified; or they may elect to wait for the chance of a vacancy (b). When vacancies (b) occur, they will be offered in rotation to the qualified Candidates then on the

list, who will be free to decline them without forfeiting their claim to subsequent vacancies (b). The declaration of choice is irrevocable, and the name of a Candidate accepting a vacancy (a) or (b) is thereupon removed from the list of Candidates awaiting appointment.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination, commencing on the 7th December 1911, will be held in London, Edinburgh, and Dublin, under the foregoing Regulations.

No person will be admitted to the Examination from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 9th November, an application, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
