FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 25th October 1911, he made an Order under section 116 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, applying the provisions of that section, with modifications, to non-textile factories and workshops, or parts thereof, in which the under-mentioned classes of work, or any of them, are carried on, and to out-workers employed in those classes of work and the occupiers and contractors by whom they are employed:—

- (1) The making up, ornamenting, finishing, and repairing of table linen, bed linen, or other household linen (including in the term linen articles of cotton or cotton and linen mixtures), and any processes incidental thereto.
- (2) The making of curtains and furniture hangings, and any processes incidental thereto.
- (3) Processes incidental to the making of lace.

This Order does not apply to any work to which the Bleaching and Dyeing Particulars Order, dated 22nd November 1909, applies.
