NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.

ORDER Prescribing Form of Requisition for Certificate of BIRTH.

TO ALL REGISTRARS OF BIRTHS, DEATHS, AND MARRIAGES IN SCOTLAND,
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 114 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, it is enacted as follows:—

“Where for the purposes of this Act, the age of any person is required to be proved by the production of a certificate of birth, any person shall, on presenting a written requisition in such form and containing such particulars as may be from time to time prescribed by the Local Government Board for England, Scotland, or Ireland, as the case may be, and, on payment of a fee of sixpence, be entitled to obtain a certified copy of the entry of the birth of that person in the birth register, under the hand of the registrar or superintendent registrar having the custody thereof, and forms for such requisition shall on request be supplied without any charge by every registrar of births and deaths and by every superintendent registrar.”

Now therefore We, the Local Government Board for Scotland, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The requisition to be made to entitle any person to obtain, under the section above cited, a certificate of birth under the hand of the Registrar shall be in the Form set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

ARTICLE II.—This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of March one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

Education (Scotland) Act, 1908.
PROPOSED ORDER BY THE SCOTCH EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.
SCHOOL BOARD OF BLAIRGOWRIE.
SCHOOL BOARD OF RATTRAY.

WHEREAS by subsection (1) of section 22 of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908 (8 Edward 7, cap. 63), it is enacted that where it is represented to the Department by a School Board that it would be expedient that the district or part of a district of the said school board should be united with the adjacent district or part of district of another school board, so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one school board, the Department shall consult with the authorities concerned, and may cause a local inquiry to be held, and, if they are of opinion that the districts should be united, may by order provide for uniting the said districts as aforesaid :

And whereas it has been represented to the Department by the School Board of the Parish of Blairgowrie that it would be expedient that the district of the said School Board should be united with the adjacent district of the School Board of the Parish of Rattray, so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one school board :

And whereas the Department, after consulting with the authorities concerned and causing a local inquiry to be held, are of opinion that the said districts should be united as aforesaid :

And whereas it is expedient that the said districts should be united as aforesaid :

Now therefore the Department, in virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred upon them by the enactment above recited, do hereby order as follows, *videlicet* :—

1. The district of the School Board of the Parish of Blairgowrie shall, from and after the date at which this Order shall commence to have effect, be united with the district of the School Board of the Parish of Rattray so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one School Board.

2. The existing School Boards shall cease to exist, and there shall be established in their room for the districts united as aforesaid one school board to be called "The School Board of Blairgowrie and Rattray."

3. The said School Board of Blairgowrie and Rattray (hereinafter referred to as "the School Board") shall consist of the fourteen members who at the date hereof constitute the said existing school boards. The said members shall hold office until the school board election to be held in the year 1914 in terms of the Education (Scotland) Acts, 1872 to 1908, after which date the number of members of the School Board shall be nine.

4. The whole property, heritable and moveable, real and personal, including the respective school funds and any funds held in trust, belonging to the existing school boards, and all debts and obligations due to the existing school boards, shall be transferred to and vested in the School Board in property or in trust as the case may be ; and, save as hereinafter provided, all teachers, janitors, officers, and other employees in the service of the existing school boards shall be transferred to, and become teachers, janitors, officers, and employees in the service of the School Board.

Provided always that the School Board shall not be bound to take over the Clerk and Treasurer to the School Board of the Parish of Rattray, but such officer shall receive a gratuity of forty guineas as compensation from the School Board.

5. The whole debts and liabilities of the existing school boards shall be taken over by, and become debts and liabilities of, the School Board.

6. For a period of five years commencing with the 16th day of May 1912, the annual deficiency in the school fund of the School Board requiring to be provided by means of a local rate shall be provided in manner following, that is to say, a special rate shall be levied upon the district of the existing School Board of the Parish of Blairgowrie of the amount of one penny in the pound. The remainder of the sum required in each year shall be provided by a uniform rate upon the whole of the School Board district constituted by this Order.

7. From and after the 16th day of May 1917 the arrangement provided for in the immediately preceding clause shall cease to have effect, and thereafter the deficiency in the School Fund of the School Board shall be provided by means of a rate levied upon the district of the said School Board.

8. The whole expenses of the proceedings in connection with this Order shall be defrayed out of the school fund of the School Board.

9. In this Order the expression "the Department" means the Scotch Education Department.

10. This Order shall commence to have effect on the sixteenth day of May one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

MOTOR CARS.

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (COUNTY OF ARGYLL) (DISTRICT OF THE ISLAND OF MULL) ORDER, 1912, dated March 23, 1912.

In pursuance of the powers vested in me by section 9, as read with section 18 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, I, the Right Honourable Thomas M'Kinnon Wood, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, on the application of the County Council of the County of Argyll, being the local authority of the said County, do hereby make the following regulations :—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (County of Argyll) (District of the Island of Mull) Order, 1912," and the regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect within the limits or places referred to therein, on and after the respective dates at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the local authority shall, in terms of section 10 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, place notices in conspicuous places on or near such limits or places.
2. A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour within the limits or places specified in the schedule to this Order.
3. Upon the preceding regulation taking effect, the regulations prescribed by the Motor Cars Regulation (County of Argyll) (No. 1) Order, 1905, and by the Motor Cars Regulation (County of Argyll) (District of the Island of Mull) Order, 1908, shall cease to have effect as regards such portions of the highways specified in the schedule thereto as are included in the limits or places specified in the schedule to this Order.



* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
