NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911. (1 and 2 Geo. V., ch. 55.)

TABLE OF RESERVE VALUES FOR FEMALE INSURED PERSONS.

Whereas by section 55 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, the Insurance Commissioners are required and empowered to cause tables to be prepared showing, in cases in which such provision is necessary, the capital sums (in that Act and herein referred to as "Reserve Values") which it is necessary to provide in respect of members entering into insurance at ages over the age of 16 to meet the estimated loss, if any, arising through the acceptance by an Approved Society of such persons as members upon the terms and conditions as regards contributions and benefits prescribed by that Act; and whereas by section 83 of that Act it is provided that the Joint Committee constituted thereunder shall exercise and perform such powers and duties of the several bodies of Commissioners under that Act as may be provided by regulations to be made by the Treasury; and whereas by the regulations made by the Treasury thereunder it is provided that the Joint Committee alone shall exercise the power of making under subsection 1 of section 55 of the Act tables showing reserve values : Now, therefore, the Joint Committee in pursuance of the powers above recited and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf have caused to be prepared the tables hereto appended, showing in cases in which such provision is necessary the reserve values which it is necessary to provide in Great Britain or in Ireland in respect of female employed contributors entering into insurance, within one year after the commencement of the Act, at the ages shown in the first column of that table, and in respect of female voluntary contributors entering into insurance, within six months after the commencement of the Act, at the ages less than the age of forty-five shown in the first column of that table, and that table shall have effect accordingly.
