Education (Scotland) Act, 1908.

PROPOSED ORDER BY THE SCOTCH EDUCATION
DEPARTMENT.

SCHOOL BOARD OF PERTH (BURGH).

SCHOOL BOARD OF PERTH EAST
PARISH (LANDWARD).

WHEREAS by subsection (1) of section 22 of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908 (8 Edward 7, cap. 63), it is enacted that where it is represented to the Department by a School Board that it would be expedient that the district or part of a district of the said school board should be united with the adjacent district or part of district of another school board, so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one school board, the Department shall consult with the authorities concerned, and may cause a local inquiry to be held, and, if they are of opinion that the districts should be united, may by order provide for uniting the said districts as aforesaid :

And whereas it has been represented to the Department by the School Board of the Burgh of Perth and the School Board of the East Parish of Perth (Landward) that it would be expedient that their respective districts should be united so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one school board :

And whereas, after due consideration of the matter, the Department are of opinion that the said districts should be united as aforesaid :

And whereas it is expedient that the said districts should be united as aforesaid :

Now therefore the Department, in virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred upon them by the enactment above recited, do hereby order as follows, videlicet :—

1. The district of the School Board of the

Burgh of Perth shall, from and after the date at which this Order shall commence to have effect, be united with the district of the School Board of the East Parish of Perth (Landward) so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one School Board.

2. The existing School Boards shall cease to exist, and there shall be established in their room for the districts united as aforesaid one school board to be called "The School Board of Perth."

3. The said School Board of Perth (hereinafter referred to as "the School Board") shall consist of the fourteen members who at the date hereof constitute the said existing school boards. The said members shall hold office until the school board election to be held in the year 1914 in terms of the Education (Scotland) Acts, 1872 to 1908, after which date the number of members of the School Board shall be eleven.

4. The whole property, heritable and moveable, real and personal, including the respective school funds and any funds held in trust, belonging to the existing school boards, and all debts and obligations due to the existing school boards, shall be transferred to and vested in the School Board in property or in trust as the case may be; and all teachers, janitors, officers, and other employees in the service of the existing school boards shall be transferred to, and become teachers, janitors, officers, and employees in the service of the School Board.

5. The whole debts and liabilities of the existing school boards shall be taken over by, and become debts and liabilities of, the School Board.

6. The School Board of the Burgh of Perth shall pay to the School Board of the East Parish of Perth (Landward) during the financial year terminating on the fifteenth day of May 1913

the sum of One hundred and fifty pounds sterling. Payment of the said sum shall be made in two equal instalments, the first on the 11th day of November 1912, and the second not later than the 1st day of May 1913.

7. In this Order the expression "the Department" means the Scotch Education Department.

8. This Order shall commence to have effect on the sixteenth day of May one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.

(1 & 2 Geo. V., ch. 55).

The Joint Committee of the several bodies of Commissioners appointed for the purposes of Part I. of the National Insurance Act, 1911, and the Scottish Insurance Commissioners constituted under the said Act, acting jointly, hereby give notice that, pursuant to the provisions of the National Health Insurance (Special Orders Acceleration) Order, 1912, they have made a Provisional Special Order in the terms of the Draft Special Order under section 47 of the said Act (of which they have already published notice)—

(a) Specifying the following employments as being classes of employment in which a custom or practice prevails according to which the persons employed receive full remuneration during periods of disease or disablement, or some part thereof, namely—(1) employment as a farm servant under a contract of not less than six months' duration (male persons only); (2) employment as a farm servant under a contract of not less than six months' duration where the terms of service include lodging in the farm house (female persons only).

(b) Containing provisions for the purpose of adapting the other provisions of Part I. of the said Act to cases under section 47 of the Act.

NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.

PART II.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE.

Whereas on the 24th day of June 1912, the Board of Trade gave notice, pursuant to section 113 (1) of the National Insurance Act, 1911, that they proposed to make a Special Order under section 104 of the National Insurance Act, excluding the following employments from the occupations which are to be deemed employment in an insured trade for the purposes of Part II. of the Act (Unemployment Insurance):—

- (1) The drivers or attendants of any vehicle.
- (2) Stablemen or other workmen employed in tending horses or to clean any vehicle.
- (3) Woodcarvers.
- (4) Workmen employed in the manufacture and fitting of upholstery for the purpose of the construction, alteration, repair or decoration of buildings, ships, boats, or other craft.
- (5) Workmen employed in the manufacture of

fittings of leather or celluloid for cycles or motor cycles.

And whereas certain objections have been made with respect to the Special Exclusion Order so proposed:

And whereas the Board of Trade have duly considered these objections and do not propose to amend or withdraw the draft Order:

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Trade have directed an inquiry to be held with regard to the draft Order, and that they have appointed Mr. A. A. Hudson, K.C., of 5 Paper Buildings, Temple, London, E.C., to hold the inquiry and to report to them thereon.

The inquiry will be held in public in the Council Chamber at 8 Richmond Terrace, Westminster, London, S.W., July 24, commencing at 11 A.M. Any objector, and any other person who in the opinion of the person holding the inquiry is affected by the draft Order, may appear at the inquiry either in person or by Counsel, Solicitor, or other Agent.

* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
