# ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1912 (No. 4).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Amendment Order of 1912 shall be read and have effect as if Limerick, Waterford, and Wexford were included in the Second Schedule thereto (Ports from which animals may be brought).
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Amendment Order of 1912 (No. 4).
