REGULATIONS FOR PINING CURED WHITE
HERRINGS.

NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given that the Fishery Board for Scotland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Section 2 of the Act 14 and 15 Vict., cap. 26, and Section 5 (1) of the Act 45 and 46 Vict., cap. 78, have resolved that on and after 1st June 1913 barrels or half barrels containing cured white herrings, other than "mattie" herrings taken prior to 10th July, shall be entitled to be officially branded if the herrings have lain in salt nine clear days, exclusive of the day of cure and the day of filling up for branding, and if they otherwise conform to the Board's Regulations; and that barrels or half barrels containing "mattie" herrings taken prior to 10th July shall be entitled to be officially branded if such herrings have lain in salt six clear days, exclusive as aforesaid, and conform otherwise to the Board's Regulations.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 4TH MARCH 1913.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The date on which Chapter I. (*Importation*) of the Horses (Importation and Transit) Order of 1912 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) shall come into operation is hereby further altered to the first day of July nineteen hundred and thirteen.

2. The provisions of paragraph (ix.) (*Food and Water*) of Article 13 of the principal Order shall not, until the first day of July nineteen hundred and thirteen, apply to a vessel on which horses, asses, or mules are carried to any port in Great Britain or from any such port to any port in the British Islands.

3. The first day of July nineteen hundred and thirteen shall be substituted for the first day of January nineteen hundred and thirteen in

the Schedule to the principal Order (*Orders Revoked*).

Paragraphs (iv.) and (viii.) of Article 3 (*Provisions as to Vessels carrying Animals*) of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") shall be read and have effect as if the first day of July nineteen hundred and thirteen were therein substituted for the first day of January nineteen hundred and thirteen as the date of application of the provisions of those paragraphs to vessels which on the eighteenth day of March eighteen hundred and ninety-five were regularly employed in conveying animals.

2. Paragraph (xii.) (*Food and Water*) of Article 3 of the principal Order shall, in respect of animals carried before the first day of July nineteen hundred and thirteen, be read and have effect as if the word "eighteen" were therein substituted for the word "twelve."
