

CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION,
September 30, 1913.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in London, Edinburgh, and Dublin, commencing on the 9th December 1913, under the Regulations dated the 10th October 1911, and published in the London Gazette of the same date, relating to the following group of situations, viz. :—

Admiralty: Junior Appointments in the Supply and Accounting Departments;

* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
