CLOSING OF OLD BURIAL GROUND at METHILMILL, in the Parish of Wemyss, Fifeshire.

A PETITION has been presented in the Sheriff Court of Fife and Kinross at Kirkcaldy, by the Parish Council of the Parish of Wemyss, in the County of Fife, praying the Court to find and declare that the Burial Ground situated at Methilmill, in the Parish of Wemyss, known as the Old Burial Ground, is offensive, and that it would be contrary to decency to make any interments therein except of bodies of spouses of persons already buried there, in terms of Section 4 of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855.

Upon which Petition the Sheriff, of date 15th October 1913, issued a Deliverance assigning Wednesday the 29th day of October 1913, at 11.30 a.m., within the Sheriff Court House at Kirkcaldy, for inquiring into the allegations mentioned in the Petition, and for taking the evidence of any Witnesses that may be
