Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire into the relationship between the Railway Companies of Great Britain and the State in respect of matters other than safety of working and conditions of employment, and to report what changes, if any, are desirable in that relationship:

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorised and appointed, and do by these Presents authorise and appoint you, the said Robert Threshie, Earl Loreburn (Chairman); Edward George Villiers, Earl of Derby; Frederick Huth Jackson, Sir Henry William Primrose, Sir Frederick Robert Upcott, Sir William Plender, Rowland Edmund Prothero, Arthur Balfour, and David James Shackleton to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the

premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorise and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matter herein submitted for your consideration.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, the twenty-fourth day of October one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the fourth year of Our Reign.

ORDER consenting to the Acquisition of Land for the purposes of Part III. of the Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890.

ROYAL BURGH OF LANARK.

To the Provost, Magistrates, and Councillors of the Royal Burgh of Lanark, and to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Town Council of the Royal Burgh of Lanark (hereinafter referred to as "The Town Council") are the Local Authority within the said Royal Burgh under the Housing of the Working Classes Acts, 1890 to 1909:

AND WHEREAS in the application of the aforesaid Acts to Scotland, by virtue of Section 53, sub-section (1) of the Housing, Town Planning, &c., Act, 1909, the Local Government Board for Scotland shall, except as otherwise provided, be substituted for the Local Government Board:

AND WHEREAS, in terms of sub-section 3 of Section 2 of the Housing, Town Planning, &c., Act, 1909, the Town Council passed a Resolution on the eleventh day of August 1913, applying to Us, the Local Government Board for Scotland, for Our consent to the acquisition for the purposes of Part III. of the Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890, of two plots of land extending in all to one acre or thereby situated in the Burgh of Lanark and on the lands of South Hospitlands, that is to say:—

- (1) That plot of land bounded on the north by the road leading from Lanark to Edinburgh along which it extends 110 feet or thereby, on the east by a proposed new road or street along which it extends 204 feet 6 inches or thereby, on the south by remaining portions of the lands of South Hospitlands along which it extends 110 feet or thereby, and on the west by part of the lands of East Maddermains along which it extends 204 feet 6 inches or thereby; and
- (2) That plot of land bounded on the north by the road leading from Lanark to Edinburgh along which it extends 110 feet or thereby, on the east by part of the lands of South Hospitlands along which it extends 176 feet or thereby, on the south by another portion of the said lands of South Hospitlands along which it extends 110 feet or thereby, and on the west by the proposed new road or street along which it extends 204 feet 6 inches or thereby;

all of which belong to the Town Council as Trustees of Hospitlands Mortification and presently occupied by Mr. Joseph Murphy, farmer, Castleyett, Lanark:

AND WHEREAS, by virtue of sub-section 3 of Section 2 of the Housing, Town Planning, &c., Act, 1909, We may impose any conditions in giving Our consent as aforesaid:

AND WHEREAS the Resolution of the Town Council, together with a Plan of the lands, has been transmitted to Us, and We have enquired into the Application and into the circumstances connected therewith:

Now THEREFORE WE, the Local Government Board for Scotland, do hereby, under the provisions of sub-section 3 of Section 2 of the Housing, Town Planning, &c., Act, 1909, consent to the acquisition by the Tewn Council of the afore-

said plots of land subject to the following conditions, that is to say:—

- (a) The aforesaid plots of land shall be feued at the rate of £12 per acre per annum;
- (b) A Housing Scheme in the sense of Part III. of the Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890, shall be begun on the aforesaid plots of land within one year from the date of this Our Order, and shall be proceeded with to Our satisfaction; and
- (c) All houses to be built upon the feus of the aforesaid plots of land and facing the road leading from Lanark to Edinburgh shall be cottages or semi-detached cottages conform to plans approved by Us.

^{*} Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
