Copy of a Letter from Sir Robert Calder, Bart. Vice-Admiral of the Blue, to the Honourable William Cornwallis, Admiral of the White, &c. dated on board his Majesty's ship the Prince of Wales, the 25th of July 1805.

SIR,  
I am induced to send, by the Windfor Castle, a triplicate of my dispatch of the 23d instant. Since the proven rental was made up, and the upset price fixed by the Court, it has been discovered that the common debtor has right to the teinds, and before the day of sale arrives, authority will be obtained from the Court for including the teinds in the subjects under sale.
