EDUCATION (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1908.

PROPOSED ORDER Modifying Order No. 17 by the Scotch Education Department which appeared in the Edinburgh Gazette of Tuesday, May 14th, 1912.

SCHOOL BOARD OF FORRES.

WHEREAS by Order dated the tenth day of May 1912, the Scotch Education Department (hereinafter called the Department) in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908, Section 22, united the district of the School Board of Forres (Burgh) with the district of the School Board of the Parish of Forres (Landward) so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one School Board:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of the said Section it is enacted that such Order shall have effect as if enacted by Parliament, unless or until revoked or modified by subsequent Order in terms of the said Section:

And whereas the Department after due consideration of the matter are of opinion that the said Order ought to be modified to the extent and effect hereinafter set forth:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order should be so modified:

Now therefore the Department, in the exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon them as aforesaid, do order as follows, *videlicet* :—

1. The said Order dated the tenth day of May 1912 shall be, and the same is hereby modified as follows, *vizt.* :—

Section 6 of the said Order is hereby revoked as from the date at which this Order shall

commence to have effect, and there shall be substituted therefor the following temporary provisions with respect to the deficiency in the school fund of the School Board of Forres and the sum required to meet the same, *vizt.* :—

For the year from Whitsunday 1914 to Whitsunday 1915 there shall be allocated upon the district of the School Board of Forres (Burgh) as the same existed prior to the commencement of the said Order dated the tenth day of May 1912, a sum of £140; and the balance of the sum requiring to be provided as aforesaid shall be provided by a uniform rate upon the whole of the district of the School Board of Forres constituted by the said Order.

2. This Order shall commence to have effect on the sixteenth day of May one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.
