ALTERATION OF PARISH AREAS.

FINAL ORDER NO. XLIX.

(PARISHES OF DUNFERMLINE AND INVERKEITHING).

WHEREAS it has been represented to me by the Parish Council of the Parish of Dunfermline that I should issue an Order under Section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1889 and Section 46 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1894, annexing to the Parish of Dunfermline that portion of the Parish of Inverkeithing which by the Dunfermline Burgh Extension and Drainage Act 1911, was annexed to the Burgh of Dunfermline; and whereas, after consulting with the authorities concerned and causing a local enquiry to be held, I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the said representation: and whereas I caused the proposed Order to be published in the Edinburgh Gazette of 3rd April 1914.

Now THEREFORE I, the Right Honourable Thomas M'Kinnon Wood, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do, in virtue of the powers conferred

Acts, order as follows:-

- (1) The portion of the said Parish of Inverkeithing annexed to the Burgh of Dunfermline by the said Dunfermline Burgh Extension and Drainage Act, 1911, shall cease to form part of the Parish of Inverkeithing, and shall form part of the Parish of Dunfermline.
- (2) The Parish Council of Dunfermline shall assume responsibility for, and shall relieve the Parish Council of Inverkeithing of all advances which the latter body may be called upon to make for, or on account of, any pauper whose claim is derived (1) from birth in the said portion of the Parish of Inverkeithing prior to the 15th day of May 1914, or (2) from residence for the statutory period in the said portion of the Parish of Inverkeithing prior to the 15th day of May 1914.
- (3) Nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of creditors or of persons having vested interests; and all questions of compensation or adjustment following on this Order, except so far as herein dealt with, are expressly reserved.
- (4) This Order shall take effect as from the 15th day of May 1914.

EDUCATION (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1908. ORDER No. 30 BY THE SCOTCH EDUCA-TION DEPARTMENT.

SCHOOL BOARD OF BURNTISLAND.

At Dover House, Whitehall, the thirteenth day of May 1914.

By the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education in Scotland.

THEREAS by subsection (1) of Section 22 of the Education (Scotland Act, 1908 (8 Edward 7, cap. 63), it is enacted that, where it is represented to the Department by a School Board that it would be expedient that the district or part of a district of the said school board should be united with the adjacent district or part of district of another school board, so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one school board, the Department shall consult with the authorities concerned, and may cause a local inquiry to be held, and, if they are of opinion that the districts should be united, may by Order provide for uniting the said districts as aforesaid:

And whereas it has been represented to the Department by the School Board of Burntisland (Burgh) that it would be expedient that the district of the said School Board should be united with the adjacent district of the School Board of Burntisland (Landward), so as for all listing school boards shall be taken over by,

upon me by the Local Government (Scotland) | purposes to constitute a district under one school board:

> And whereas the existing Boards are agreed upon the terms upon which such union should take place:

> And whereas the Department, after consulting with the authorities concerned, are of opinion that the said districts should be united as aforesaid:

> And whereas it is expedient that the said districts should be united as aforesaid:

> And whereas a proposed Order to that offect was duly published in the Edinburgh Gazette of 31st March 1914, in terms of subsection (2) of Section 22 as aforesaid:

> And whereas all objections and representations respecting the same have been duly considered:

> Now therefore the Department, in virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred upon them by the enactment above recited, do hereby order as follows, videlicet:


- 1. The district of the School Board of Burntisland (Burgh) shall, from and after the date at which this Order shall commence to have effect, be united with the district of the School Board of Burntisland (Landward) so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one School Board.
- 2. The existing School Boards shall cease to exist, and there shall be established in their room for the districts united as aforesaid one school board to be called "The School Board of Burntisland.'
- 3. The said School Board of Burntisland (hereinafter referred to as "The School Board") shall consist of nine members. The members of the said School Board shall be elected for the first time on Tuesday, the twenty-sixth day of May 1914, conform to such regulations as may be prescribed by the Department in virtue of their statutory powers, and Mr. Robert Brown, Solicitor, Burntisland, is hereby appointed to be the Returning Officer on the occasion of that

The first meeting of the School Board shall be summoned by Mr. Robert Brown, and shall be held on Friday, the twenty-ninth day of May 1914, at the hour and place named in the summons, and such meeting shall be deemed to be the first statutory meeting of the School Board.

4. The whole property, heritable and moveable, real and personal, including the respective school funds and any funds held in trust, belonging to the existing school boards, and all debts and obligations due to the existing school boards shall be transferred to and vested in the School Board in property or in trust as the case may be; and all teachers, janitors, officers, and other employees in the service of the existing school boards shall be transferred to, and become teachers, janitors, officers, and employees in the service of the School Board.

Provided always that the School Board of Burntisland shall not be bound to take over the Clerk and Treasurer to the School Board of Burntisland (Landward), but such officer shall receive a gratuity of forty pounds as compensation from the School Board of Burntisland.

5. The whole debts and liabilities of the ex-



and become debts and liabilities of, the School Board.

6. In this Order the expression "the Department" means the Scotch Education Department.

7. Notwithstanding the date hereof, this Order shall be deemed to have taken effect for all purposes connected with the election of the School Board as at the first day of May one thousand nine hundred and fourteen; and, quoad ultra, this Order shall commence to have effect on the twenty-sixth day of May one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.
