that Act may be revoked, varied, or amended by an Order or Special Order made in like manner as the original Order:

Now, therefore, the Joint Committee, in pursuance of the power conferred on them by Section 78 of the Act and by sub-section (1) of Section 40 of the amending Act and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Outstanding Reserve Values) Amendment Order, 1914, and shall be read as one with the National Health Insurance (Outstanding Reserve Values) Order, 1914.

2. Paragraph (1) of Article 1 of the National Health Insurance (Outstanding Reserve Values) Order, 1914, shall be read as though for the words "a sum ascertained by multiplying, in the case of a man, one-half of one per cent., or in the case of a woman, one per cent., of the appropriate reserve value" there were substituted the words "a sum ascertained by multiplying one-half of one per cent. of the appropriate reserve value."
