To inquire into and report on the methods of making appointments to and promotions in the Civil Service, including the Diplomatic and Consular Services, and the legal departments;

To investigate the working and efficiency of the system of competitive examination for such appointments, and to make recommendations for any alterations or improvements in that system which may appear to be advisable; and

To consider whether the existing scheme of organisation meets the requirements of the Public Service, and to suggest any modifications which may be needed therein:

Now know ye that We have revoked and

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do by these Presents authorise and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Inspector of Stores in the Office of His Majesty's Works, &c. (Supplementary to the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of the 10th January 1910.)

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 23 and 35: candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

II. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English Composition.
2. Arithmetic.
3. Technical knowledge.

No candidate will be eligible who fails to pass in any of the above subjects.

III. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

IV. A fee of 12s. 6d. will be required from each candidate attending an examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for at least one situation as Inspector of Stores in the Office of His Majesty's Works, &c., will be held in London under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 27th April 1915.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 25th March, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

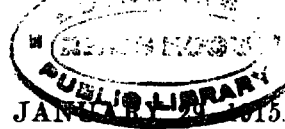
