### PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Secretary for Scotland has, under the provisions of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation that he has received a copy of an Interlocutor of the Sheriff-Substitute of Stirling, Dumbarton, and Clackmannan at Falkirk, dated the 3rd March 1915, and made on a Petition of the Parish Council of the Parish of Falkirk, finding that the Old Burial Ground at Chapel Yard, in the Village of Bonnybridge, in the Parish of Falkirk and County of Stirling, is dangerous to health, and offensive and contrary to decency:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that the said Old Burial Ground should be closed forthwith in terms of the said Act as a place of sepulture:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased to give notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 4th day of May next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order, or notice thereof, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and that copies of this Order, or notice thereof, be fixed as required by the above-mentioned Act on the doors of the church of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before such Representation is so considered.

  - 6. Fersons tendering for Bills are hereby

notified that, having regard to the provisions of the Acts 22 George III., cap. 45, and 41 George III., cap. 52, the acceptance of any such Tender is subject to the express condition that no Member of the House of Commons shall be admitted to any share or part in or to any benefit to arise from the Contract thereby made for the allotment of such Bills.

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (COUNTY OF ORKNEY ORDER, 1915, dated 22nd March 1915.

In pursuance of the powers vested in me by Section 9, as read with Section 18 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, I, the Right Honourable Thomas M'Kinnon Wood, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, on the application of the County Council of the County of Orkney, being the local authority of the said County, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

 This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (County of Orkney) Order, 1915," and the Regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect within the limits or places referred to therein on and after the respective dates at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the local authority shall, in terms of Section 10 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, place notices in conspicuous places on or near such limits or places.

 A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour within the limits or places specified in the Schedule to this Order.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 20TH MARCH 1915.)

### DISEASES OF ANIMALS (AYRSHIRE) ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations for Notification of the death of Cattle in certain cases.

- 1. The Local Authority of any Discrict specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations—
  - (1) For prescribing and regulating the notice to be given to or by any person or authority in the case of illness of any head of cattle where the animal has died from the illness or been slaughtered on account thereof, and for supplementing or varying for those purposes any of the provisions of Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894; and
  - (2) For regulating the removal or disposal of the carcase of any head of cattle to which any such notice relates.

#### Limitation of Regulations.

2.—(1) Nothing in any Regulations made under this Order shall require notice to be given in the case of death produced by, or consequent on, accident or calving.

(2) Nothing in any Regulations made under this Order shall affect the provisions of any Order of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries relating to cattle-plague, pleuro-pneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, or anthrax.

#### Confirmation of Regulations.

- 3.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply:—
  - (i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District two weeks at least before the making of the application.
  - (ii.) For two weeks at least before an application a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.
  - (iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such rate-payer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.
  - (3) A copy of any Regulations made by a

Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

#### Offences.

4. Any person failing to give the notice prescribed by any Regulation made under this Order, or moving or disposing, or permitting the removal or disposal of, a carcase, in contravention of any such Regulation, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the DISEASES OF ANIMALS (AYRSHIRE) ORDER OF 1915.
