2190	Lance-Corporal	Drew, T. A. W. ...	2nd Battalion, Monmouthshire Regiment (T.F.)	For conspicuous gallantry on 2nd January 1915, at Le Touquet, in voluntarily going to the rescue of a dangerously wounded comrade in full view of the enemy, who were only a hundred yards distant. Lance-Corporal Drew brought the wounded man into cover, but was himself wounded in doing so.
899	Corporal ...	Duffy, T. ...	1st Battalion, Manchester Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry near Neuve Chapelle on 27th November 1914, in the attack on the enemy's sap-heads, and subsequently for great courage in leaving his trench under very heavy machine gun fire and bringing three wounded men into cover.
3972	Private ...	Dunster, W. ...	1st Battalion, Devonshire Regiment	For gallant conduct on many occasions in attending on the wounded under fire whilst acting as stretcher-bearer, and also for gallantry and coolness on 20th November 1914, in removing the wounded from the trenches under fire of the enemy's snipers.
4725	Serjeant ...	Edwards, H. ...	1st Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment	For gallant conduct on 3rd January 1915, at Neuve Chapelle, in the able assistance rendered in the attack on a German trench, when 30 of the occupants were killed or wounded.
16576	Sapper ...	Edwards, T. ...	15th Field Company, Royal Engineers	For gallantry on 15th November 1914, in assisting to place wire entanglements in front of our trenches under fire from the enemy, who were only 100 yards distant.
7927	Acting-Serjeant	Edwards, W. C. ...	1st Battalion, East Surrey Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry at Richebourg on 28th and 29th October 1914, in bringing wounded men from the fire trenches under close and constant fire of the enemy, who were only 150 yards distant.
25071	Pioneer ...	Elms, G. E. ...	7th Field Company, Royal Engineers	For gallant conduct near Le Touquet on 22nd January 1915, in assisting in the rescue of a wounded man under fire from the enemy, who were only 40 yards distant.
5799	Company Serjeant-Major	Elson, W. ...	2nd Battalion, Royal West Surrey Regiment	For gallant conduct on 21st October 1914; after his platoon Commander had been wounded he took command and did excellent service. Has been noted for his gallantry on several occasions.
1414	Private ...	Emery, F. E. ...	13th (Kensington) Battalion, The London Regiment (T.F.)	For conspicuous gallantry on 8th December 1914, in assisting to carry a wounded man on a stretcher, although himself seriously wounded. He completed his duty and then immediately collapsed.
28764	Corporal ...	Erskine, J. ...	Royal Engineers (Cyclist)	For gallant conduct in conveying messages under shell fire until machine was destroyed by shrapnel.
18602	Lance-Corporal ...	Evans, F. ...	4th Battalion, Royal Fusiliers	For gallant conduct and great coolness on numerous occasions in conveying messages under very heavy fire.
8910	Private ...	Evans, H. ...	1st Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment	For gallant conduct on 3rd January 1915, at Neuve Chapelle, in the able assistance rendered in the attack on a German trench when 30 of the occupants were killed or wounded.
27518	Bombardier	Evans, J. P. ...	"N" Battery, Royal Horse Artillery	For gallant conduct on 20th December 1914, near Givenchy, in laying, working, and repairing telephone lines under heavy fire.
