When the enemy succeeded in breaking through a portion of our line, this man, on his own initiative and single handed, brought up a machine gun, and by its effective use was largely instrumental in stopping any further advance by the enemy. Private Reid's prompt action averted what might otherwise have been a very serious situation.
97 82	Private	Ridgew ay, J.	2nd Battalion, Loyal North Lancashire Regiment	For gallant conduct on 4th November 1914, during the attack at Tanga (East Africa), and for general good work performed under a heavy fire.
11299	Private	Riggs, F. E	1st Battalion, Wor- cestershire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at Neuve Chapelle. Although twice wounded whilst covering a distance of 250 yards he still went forward in the attack, and finally when his platoon was ordered to retire he helped to drag the wounded into safety.
12877	Private	Riley, J	1st Battalion, Wor- cestershire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty to Neuve Chapelle. Whilst advancing with his platoon in the attack he attended to several wounded men at great personal risk. Subse- quently he was severely wounded in the head and both legs whilst perform- ing similar acts of gallant conduct.
63269	Gunner	Risk, J	7th Battery, Royal Field Artillery	For conspicuous gallantry at Neuve Chapelle when he remained at his post from 10th to 13th March 1915, in an exposed observation station, under continuous fire. During the operations at Neuve Chapelle, extend- ing from 30th October 1914, to 13th March 1915, he was constantly en- gaged in repairing wires under fire.
1296	Private	Robertson, J. M	Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry	For conspicuous gallantry at St. Eloi on 28th February 1915, in assisting in the rescue of a wounded comrade under the most difficult and dangerous circumstances.
76095	Sapper	Robertson, J. W	8th Signal Company, Royal Engineers	For gallant conduct in repairing tele- phone lines under fire at Neuve Chapelle from 10th to 14th March 1915. Showed much resource and initiative in opening up communica- tion with a neighbouring Brigade after being forced to abandon direct com- munication with his own Brigade.
4050	Serjeant	Robinson, J	lst Battalion, King's Royal Rifle Corps	For conspicuous gallantry, resource, and ability on 10th March 1915, at Givenchy. In company with another Serjeant and a small party of men he captured a trench from the enemy at 8.15 a.m., and held possession with great determination until 2 p.m., notwithstanding heavy losses—includ- ing the two Officers.
12196	Private	Robinson, W.J	3rd Battalion, Cold- stream Guards	For conspicuous gallantry on 25th and 26th April 1915, at Givenchy, in assisting to rescue Officers and men from a deep mine full of poison-gas. The courage and devotion to duty displayed were very pronounced, the risk of death through asphyxiation being very great.
9776	Serjeant (Acting- Company Serjeant- Major)	Robson, A	2nd Battalion, Royal Irish Fusiliers	For conspicuous gallantry at St. Eloi on 14th March 1915, when, almost en- circled by the enemy, he held the trench against superior numbers with marked ability, and by his determina- tion and example greatly contributed to the complete success which we eventually attained.
