PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE, June 11, 1915.

PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 6th day of June 1915, in the words following, viz. :-

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty's Order in Council, bearing date the 26th day of October 1914, authorises the payment of certain allowances to Lieutenants and Lieutenant-Com-
