Regimental No.	Rank.	Name.	Corps.	Action for which commended.
7709	Corporal ...	Wilkinson, J. B. ...	2nd Battalion, Scots Guards	For great gallantry and ability from the 16th to 18th May 1915, at Festubert, when he rallied members of different units and formed them up to resist the German counter-attacks, thus preventing the enemy getting round our right.
13588	Private ...	Williams, J. ...	1st Battalion, The Worcestershire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on the 10th May 1915, near Rouges Bancs, when he went out on several occasions in front of our lines, exposed to a heavy fire and at great personal risk, and brought in eleven men of another Regiment who had been lying out since the morning of the 9th May. Later Private Williams reconnoitred a sap over open ground between the lines, and found over sixty wounded men. In conjunction with Corporal Frazier he organised a rescue party of volunteers, and during the afternoon and night they brought in eighty more wounded men.
1073	Lance-Corporal	Willis, T. ...	2nd Battalion, Manchester Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on 22nd June 1915, near Richebourg l'Avoué, in reconnoitring the enemy's lines by day on three occasions, the risk being very great. He succeeded in recovering one of our machine guns, which had been lost in a previous attack, as well as three belt boxes.
955	Lance-Corporal	Willis, W. H. ...	1/7th Battalion, Middlesex Regiment (T.F.)	For conspicuous gallantry on the 10th May 1915, near Rouges Bancs. Seeing four men lying in the open 20 yards in front of our barbed wire, he crawled out to them with food and water. He was under rifle fire the whole time, and one of the wounded, to whom he was attending, was killed by it. Later, and under cover of darkness, he assisted in bringing in the three surviving men.
45027	Gunner ...	Wilson, A. E. ...	39th Brigade, Royal Field Artillery	For conspicuous gallantry on the 16th to the 18th May 1915, near Rue du Bois, in conveying messages under heavy shell fire from and to Brigade Headquarters. During these three days there was no delay in the delivery of these messages.
6/741	Private ...	Wilson, C. M. ...	Canterbury Battalion, New Zealand Forces	On the 8th May 1915, during operations south of Krithia (Dardanelles), for displaying great gallantry in carrying important messages under fire.
6330	Corporal ...	Wilson, F. ...	17th Lancers (attached 2nd Life Guards)	For great gallantry and coolness on the 13th May 1915, near Ypres, and for the example of zeal and steadiness he gave to the men of two sections after the senior N.C.O. had been killed. His able conduct and devotion to duty assisted greatly to repulse the enemy's first attack on his section of the trenches.
10012	Private ...	Wilson, G. ...	1st Battalion, Royal Irish Fusiliers	For conspicuous gallantry on the 24th May 1915, near Wieltje. When all the men of a gun team were killed or wounded, and the gun blown out of its emplacement, Private Wilson carried it to a new position and brought it into action.
8139	Private ...	Wilson, W. H. ...	1st Battalion, Royal Berkshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry from the 15th to the 17th May 1915, near Richebourg l'Avoué, when he carried frequent messages under heavy shell and rifle fire. On the 17th May, during a heavy bombardment, he went forward to the firing line of another Battalion, and brought back important information. During his return, he stopped, rallied, and sent forward men who were falling back in confusion under a heavy shell fire.
