| 4895           | Private ...  | Windebank, A. T. ... | 2nd Battalion, Rifle Brigade   | For conspicuous gallantry and resource on the 9th-10th May 1915, near Rouges Bancs. He carried the first message back from the Battalion to the Brigade Report Centre under a heavy rifle and machine-gun fire, returning later under the same fire. He was of the greatest assistance in helping to mount a captured machine gun and in collecting bombs in the German trenches for use against the enemy.   |
| 8748           | Private ...  | Winn, W. ...         | 4th Battalion, Liverpool Regiment  | For gallant conduct on the 22nd May 1915, at Ferme de Bois, when, in company with another man, he assisted to bring in a wounded Officer, who was lying within 150 yards of the German trenches.  |
| 2757           | Private ...  | Wood, J. H. ...      | 1/13th (County of London) Princess Louise's Kensington Battalion, The London Regiment (T.F.) | For conspicuous gallantry on the 9th May 1915, near Rouges Bancs, when he went across twice between the enemy's breakwork and the British breakwork carrying messages under a very heavy fire, and eventually brought back a party with ammunition, several of whom were killed while attempting to get across.   |
| 2782           | Private ...  | Wood, P. J. ...      | 18th County of London Battalion, The London Regiment (London Irish Rifles), T.F.             | For conspicuous gallantry on the 25th May 1915, at Givenchy. When the communication between the Keep and Battalion Headquarters had been severed, he went out, during a lull in the bombardment, and proceeded to carry out repairs. The bombardment recommenced at once, but he remained out about half an hour and completed the work.  |
| 86157          | Serjeant ... | Workman, G. ...      | 170th Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers  | For conspicuous gallantry and ability on 28th June 1915, at the Cock Shy, Cuinchy. Whilst clearing a gallery which had been damaged by a German mine he made a hole into the enemy's gallery accidentally. He at once blocked it up with sandbags and laid a charge against it. Our mine was then successfully fired, destroying the enemy's gallery and exploding the charge which they had laid. Serjeant Workman has rendered valuable service previously in work of a similarly dangerous nature. |
| 10063          | Private ...  | Wykes, F. W. ...     | 2nd Battalion, Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry                                | For conspicuous gallantry on the 16th May 1915, at Richebourg l'Avoué, in bringing up bombs under a heavy shell fire at a critical time, when they were scarce and communication difficult. Private Wykes was wounded when within 30 yards of the captured German trench.   |
| 10021          | Private ...  | Zeacle, F. ...       | 2nd Battalion, Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry                                | For conspicuous gallantry on the 16th May 1915, at Richebourg l'Avoué, in bringing up bombs under a heavy shell fire at a critical time, when they were scarce and communication difficult. Private Zeacle was wounded when within 30 yards of the captured German trench.  |
