The KING has been graciously pleased to give orders for the appointment of the following Officers to the Distinguished Service Order in recognition of the services mentioned:—

Commander Cecil Ponsonby Talbot, R.N.

For his services in sinking a German torpedo-boat destroyer off the enemy's coast on the 26th July 1915, whilst on patrol duty in his submarine.

Lieutenant-Commander (now Commander) John Beauchamp Waterlow, R.N.

For his services in the minesweeping operations in the Dardanelles between the 19th February and 17th March 1915. Lieutenant-Commannder Waterlow took part in these operations on several occasions under a heavy fire, notably on the night of 13th-14th March, when he carried the attack through an area
