A PROCLAMATION

FOR A BANK HOLIDAY.

GEORGE, R.I.

WE, considering that it is desirable that Saturday the First day of January next should be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout that part of the United Kingdom called England and Wales, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, appoint Saturday the First day of January next as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout England and Wales, and every part thereof, under and in accordance with the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-second day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the Sixth year of Our Reign.
