barley meal, and (A) Barley, pearled and pot barley; Bean flour and meal; Biscuits, bread and cakes; Butter; A) Cassava powder; A) Cheese; Cornflour; Corn grits; Eggs in shells; Fish; Hominy; Lentil flour and meal; Macaroni; Mandioca; Meat, namely bacon, ham and pork; (c) Meat, not otherwise specifically prohibited; Milk, condensed or preserved; Milk powder; (A) Oatmeal and rolled oats; (A) Onions; (A) Pea flour and meal; (A) Peas (except tinned \mathbf{and} bottled peas, and packed in cardboard boxes or similar receptacles); (A) Prepared foods wholly partially derived cereals : (A) Rice and rice flour;

 \mathbf{or} from

Rye, rye flour and meal; Sago and sago flour and meal;

(A) Semolina; Spaghetti;

Tapioca and tapioca flour;

Vegetables, canned;

Vegetables. fresh. otherwise specifically prohibited;

(A) Vermicelli; (c) Seeds, canary;

(B) Seeds, clover and grass;

(B) Seeds for root crops, the following :

Carrot; Kohl Rabi; Mangold; Onion; Swede; Turnip;

(c) Spices and mixtures thereof (except pepper);

Sponges, raw and prepared;

A) Thermometers;

(c) Valves, gas, steam and water;

Varnishes, oil; Wood pulp;

Wood-screws, made of brass, iron or steel;

(B) Zirconium minerals.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER (AMENDING) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR AREAS SITUATE IN SCOTLAND.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following Order:-

Areas to which the Order applies.

1. This Order shall apply to all areas or parts of areas situate in Scotland to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, have been applied.

Effect of Order.

2. The Article entitled "Hours of opening for "the supply of food and non-exciseable liquor" in each of the said Orders of the Board for the said respective areas shall be revoked, and in place thereof the following Article shall be inserted:-

" Closing of Licensed Premises."

"Subject to the provisions of the Article "entitled 'Saving Provisions' no person shall "(except with the authority of the Board) either "by himself or by any servant or agent open or "keep open any licensed premises for business or " for the sale of any goods or commodities whatso-"ever except on the days and during the hours "prescribed by Article 2 of this Order as the "days and hours on and during which exciseable "liquor may be sold or supplied for consumption " on the premises.

"Provided always that nothing in this Article "shall be deemed to prohibit where the same is "otherwise lawful the opening or keeping open " of-

"(a) Any licensed premises for which a "certificate is held authorising the same " to be kept as an inn and hotel, or

" (b) Any licensed premises structurally adapted "for use and bond fide used as a restaurant,

"(c) Any refreshment room in any railway "station, theatre or other place of public " entertainment, or

"(d) Any licensed premises in which exciseable "liquor is sold to be consumed off the " the premises only."

And each of the said Orders of the Board shall be read as if the foregoing Article were inserted therein.

Exhibition of Order.

3. Every holder of a licence for the sale of exciseable liquor shall keep permanently affixed
