REGULATION OF AMERICAN EXCHANGE.

DEPOSIT OF SECURITIES WITH THE TREASURY.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury announce that until further notice no

further securities will be accepted for deposit except securities which are subject to the Special Income Tax of 2s. in the £, but which have not yet appeared in any requisition order under the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

Any securities approved for deposit before the date of this announcement will be accepted if lodged not later than 31st May 1917.

The Treasury is still desirous, notwithstanding the closure of the deposit scheme, of purchasing outright American and Canadian Dollar Securities suitable for sale in the United States of America, and holders of such securities (whether they have appeared in previous lists or not) are invited to communicate with the American Dollar Securities Committee, 19 Old Jewry, E.C., from whom quotations may be obtained.
