DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER (FURTHER AMENDMENT) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE SCOTLAND, WEST CENTRAL, AREA (ARGYLL AND BUTE).

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order shall apply to so much of the Scotland (West Central Area) as comprises the Burghs of Oban and Tobermory, the Island of Mull, and the Parishes of Kilmore and Kilbride,

and Ardchattan and Muckairn, in the County of Argyll, and all arms of the sea and waters between the Island of Mull and the Mainland.

2. The Order of the Board made on the 21st day of March 1917, and now in force in the above-mentioned part of the area is hereby revoked and shall cease to have effect.

3. All the provisions of the Order of the Board for the Scotland, West Central, Area (Argyll and Bute), made on the 29th day of July 1916, which, in so far as the same affected the above-mentioned part of the area, were revoked by the said Order made on the 21st day of March 1917, are hereby re-enacted, and shall be in force in the above-mentioned part of the area as fully as if the same had not been revoked as aforesaid.

* Section 3 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
